The plaintiff denies the answer of Garnishee, wherein he says he did not owe defendant any money, nor has owed him any money since the service of the garnishment, and that he had never made any contract with him

Plaintiff states the fact to be, and asks judgment against garnishee for the following reason. -

Plaintiff states that garnishee Perry H Talbot, ^{and one Samuel Orwig} by ~~his promise of note~~ ^{at} ~~his~~ ^{bond} herewith filed dated, Germantown Woodford Co. Illinois, on the 6th day of November, one thousand eight hundred and fifty promised to pay one John Asthor or order the sum of \$132.00 one year after the date thereof, - that on the 1st October 1851. - \$10.20 cents was paid thereon, that on the 22nd of November 1851. - \$30.00 was paid thereon, - that on the 25th of April 1852. \$24.50 was paid thereon, - that on the 28th day of April 1854. - \$17.50 was paid thereon, - and that the remainder of said note with interest at the rate of 10 per cent per annum is still due unpaid, -

That said Asthor on the 18th December 1858 assigned for value received & delivered said note to defendant, Cyrus Crossley, and that said bond was the property of defendant

at the time the garnishee was summoned
and continues so to be, and still remains
due defendant & unpaid.

Wherefore plaintiff prays judgment against
garnishee for the amount due upon said
note with all interest.
