BODY TO FORT SCOTT

The body of Lawrence C. Silvers, 27 years old, of Fort Scott, Kan., who was killed in a collision of a motorcycle, on which he was riding, and a motor car Sunday morning on North Main street, was sent yesterday to Fort Scott for funeral services and burial.

Silvers was fatally injured when his machine collided with a motor car driven by Walter Fitzpatrick of Cardin, Okla., at Stone's corner, four miles north of Joplin. He suffered a fractured skull, fractured lower jaw and abrasions about the face and body. He died in a Hurlbut ambulance en route to Freeman hospital.

Saturday was Silvers' twenty-seventh birthday, and Sunday he was making the trip to Joplin with Cloyce Ater of Fort Scott, to whom the motorcycle belonged. Ater was trailing him in a motor car. Silvers turned south at Stone's corner and apparently made the curve too wide. His machine collided with the left front side of Fitzpatrick's motor car. The Cardin man, with his wife and son, was en route to Carthage, traveling north on Main street. None of the occupants of his car was hurt.

A verdict of accidental death was returned by a coroner's jury, in charge of Coroner Leroy Simmons of Sarcoxie, at an inquest held yesterday morning in the justice court of Virgil Hoerning at Webb City.

Silvers is survived by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. J. L. Silvers; a brother and a sister, all of Redfield, Kan. He was employed as a bookkeeper in Fort Scott.
