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# **Historical and Biographical Notes**

The Chief Clerk of the Missouri House of Representatives is confirmed at the beginning of each General Assembly along with the Sergeant-at-Arms, Doorkeeper, and Chaplain and serves until the next General Assembly is convened. Chief Clerks monitor proceedings and maintain House records. According to the Rules of the House, "the Chief Clerk, under the direction of the Speaker, shall prepare and keep the House Journal and seasonably record the proceedings of the House; keep regular files of House papers; attest all writs, warrants, and subpoenas issued by order of the House; keep an account of all fines imposed by the House; maintain a record of the members' attendance; keep an account of the traveling and expense allowances of all the members; transmit to the Senate messages, communications, copies, and documents of the House; keep a docket of proceedings on all bills, resolutions, and acts; and execute the commands of the House from time to time."

Chief Clerks have various duties relating to House committees, such as serving as the repository of committee minute books and submitting them to the Secretary of State before the start of the next session. They may also be authorized by the standing Committee on Administration and Accounts to keep transaction records and supply copies to committee members and the Speaker of the House. For the standing Committee on Consent and House Procedures, Chief Clerks maintain a list of courtesy resolutions.

## Dwight Fine, 1977-1980

#### Scope and Content

Dwight Fine was Chief Clerk of the Missouri House of Representatives for the 79<sup>th</sup> and 80<sup>th</sup> General Assembly (1977-1980). Fine was born in 1942 and earned "graduate degrees in American Civilization and Public Administration from Ouachita Baptist University and the University of Missouri – Columbia." Previous to his appointment as Chief Clerk, he was Administrative manager of the Office of State Auditor.

As Chief Clerk, Fine's responsibilities to the Committee on Accounts were to "maintain financial records for the House...and keep a detailed accounting of all transactions," then make quarterly reports to committee members and the Speaker. The Committee on Accounts has "sole and complete control of all financial obligations and business affairs of the House..." and "provide[s] for the receiving and receipt of all supplies, equipment, and furnishings." Other duties include: funds for operation of member's offices; allotment of offices, chamber seats, and parking spaces; and recognizing caucuses.

Contains materials from Dwight Fine's involvement in the Committee on Accounts including: correspondence, contract forms, plans and specifications, advertisements for bid, bid proposals, voting systems literature, and designs/blueprints relating to construction and renovation projects; weekly reports provided by Fine to Speaker of the House Kenneth Rothman and members of the committee, as well as miscellaneous items such as news releases, newspaper articles, blueprints for construction and renovations and related correspondence; and reports, newsletters, correspondence, Attorney General's Opinions and minutes of the committee and other organizational bodies that were involved with the committee.
