Mr. E. C. Pittman has handed us your letter to him of May 27th and requested us to take charge for you of your claim against the Estate of Mr. Humbarger, since he would probably be witness in your behalf and therefore could not very well act as your attorney.

If this meets your view, you will have to make out your claim in detail, and in the shape of a specified account, which we will then present to the Probate Court for allowance against the Estate; As executor you ~~would~~ are disqualified to act for the Estate in this matter and the Court will appoint an administrator ad litem, upon whom the claim will be served and who can then determine, whether he is ready for trial at the June Term 1901 or whether he wants to have the hearing postponed to the September Term.

For the present it will be necessary to make out a specified account of your claim, which in view of the pending claim of Dr. Hopkins, ought to contain all items of indebtedness, that you can legitimately claim, although it may largely exceed the value of the Estate.



PLAINTIFF'S BRIEF.

This is a claim for medical services rendered deceased, Philip Nuernberger, from February 1897 to June 1900, when death occurred, as proven by the daily entries made at the time of the respective calls on the deceased. The books show that the calls were made almost daily, only short intervals occurring occasionally. It is attempted by the estate to avoid payment on the ground that the books of original entry are not admissible to prove plaintiff's claim and to bottom their contention they have cited a number of Old Missouri Cases, and have stopped short when they arrived at the case of Anchor Milling Co. vs Walsh 108 Mo. 277.

"An account book of original entries, fair upon its face, and shown to have been kept in the usual course of business, even in favor of the party by whom it is kept," is admissible in evidence. Anchor Milling Co. vs Walsh 108 Mo. 277.

"Upon the long and well recognized principle that the book entries, made by the party himself or his clerk, in the usual course of business, being contemporaneous with the fact, and part of the res gestae are admissible in evidence, I think the offer of evidence made by the plaintiff should not have been rejected." Approving diction of Judge Smith of Court of Appeals.

In an action against an executor to recover for goods delivered to his testator's wife, complainants book of account, in connection with his suppletory oath, are admissible to show the delivery of the

goods.

New York Code of Civil Procedure, Section 329 provides "that no party or person interested in a suit shall be examined as a witness against the personal representative of a deceased person, but this does not forbid the introduction in evidence of the books of account against the representative."

Young vs Luce, 66 Hunn, 631, 21 N. G. Sup 225.

A physician suing his patients administrator, being incompetent to testify, may introduce his books, apparently fair and unobjectionable, and a key to explain them, without preliminary proof that the visits were ever made.

The above are a few of the many cases that can be cited on the admissability of books of original entry in evidence by plaintiff, as a means of proving his claim. If the books are admissible his claim is proven, and if the Court will notice there is not one scintilla of evidence before it against the claim, only the simple technical objection of the Counsel for the estate. I put Dr. Hopkins on the stand and he testified that he was a physician; that he entered on his books each call as he made it on deceased, and that the books were regularly and correctly kept, and contained a record of his dealings with the deceased; that the claim presented was a correct copy of the books. Then I introduced them (the books) in evidence. The books speak for themselves, and are before the Court in the itemized bill. There is no dispute only as to the prices charged and as to whether all the bill should be in the first class. There is no evidence before the Court that would warrant the claim being put in any other class then the first. Two disinterested physicians testified that from the nature of the illness of the deceased his ailment was permanent and likely to continue during the time that the doctor claims he treated him.

I submit that upon the showing made by Dr. Hopkins, and Drs. Tenn and Smith, whose testimony is not controverted, and the late decisions in this State, as well as those of other Courts, the claim is fully proven and plaintiff's brief discloses no reason why the Court should not allow the full claim of Eleven hundred and sixty-nine (1169) Dollars in the first class.
