In accordance with instructions rec<sup>d</sup>.  
from you yesterday I have the honor to enclose  
to your address, herewith, the paroles given by  
me yesterday P. M. to the sick prisoners  
of war. I found when I reached the levee  
that all had been put on board of the  
steamer Fourth Western and had arrived  
on this St. Louis side of the river. I went  
aboard at once and found a number had  
private residences to go to, and I therefore sent  
the following named prisoners to the places herein  
designated upon their parole after the form  
furnished me by you viz. Lieut. A. Collins  
Co. D. 4<sup>th</sup> Wis, Lieut. A. G. Dunn, Co. F. 30<sup>th</sup> Tenn,  
and O. A. H. Foster Lieut. Co. A. 9<sup>th</sup> Batt. Tenn, Gen.  
to the house of Dr. Wm. W. Pallen No 148 Locust St;  
Capt. W. B. Moore, Co. 73. 4<sup>th</sup> Mich. and Lieut.  
W. H. Jockey of Capt. Pope's Artillery, Tenn. to the  
house of Dr. John S. Moore, No. 18 So. Sixth, St.;

G. F. Simonton, Adjutant 1<sup>st</sup> Miss. to the house  
of Dr. H. N. Prout corner of 6<sup>th</sup> & Locust Sts.;  
W. M. G. Ponthall Adjutant 10<sup>th</sup> Tenn. and R. O.  
Bigbee Lieut Co. B. 30<sup>th</sup> Tenn. to the house of Mrs.  
Mary M. Dedman, Choteau Av. 3<sup>rd</sup> cross street  
of 7<sup>th</sup> St.; Lieut. G. M. R. Stork Co. B. 30<sup>th</sup> Tenn.;  
Lieut. W. M. Burney Co. E. 30<sup>th</sup> Tenn. were sent  
to Gen. Hospital; Lieut John P. Mellican  
26<sup>th</sup> Miss, assigned to Dr. John S. Morse's house  
18. S. Sixth St. I learn went to Gen. Hospital,  
and Reynolds, servant, was sent to Gen. Hos-  
pital. Lieut. A. D. Allen of one of the Tenn.  
Regts. died on board boat at 4 P.M. In all,  
twelve officers and one servant. I was occupied  
all the time after leaving your office until 7 P.M.  
in getting the men off the boat under parole to  
private residences and hospitals, and did not  
get word from Col. Force relative to the necessity  
of sending all to Gen. Hospital until too late.  
I have further to report that W. M. G.  
Ponthall Adj. 10<sup>th</sup> Tenn. and Lieut. A. G. Dunn  
30<sup>th</sup> Tenn. I found on board without hospital  
or leave to remain behind by me. They are accounted for  
above, and were ill but not very sick.

Genl. Schofield

Sir

I was arrested yesterday evening at the Planter's House & brought to this place upon a charge I do not know, and of the Federal officers in command have intimated that my arrest was made in consequence of not going to Columbus on the train as I expected to do when in your office yesterday morning. I called at the office of Col. Parsons about 9 o'clock yesterday (Sunday morning) & was informed by the clerk in the office that the Col. was absent - told to call again, I asked if any transportation could be obtained by Lieut. Moore in my absence he replied it could, Lieut. Moore called again at the office of Col. Parsons at 1 o'clock P.M., says ~~she~~ she was informed by a gentleman in an adjoining office (Col. Parsons' office being closed) that the Col. had gone to the country.

that we could not get transportation to Columbus until to day. Allow me to assure you that I am anxious to reach Columbus believing my exchange has been effected & notice of the fact would be sent me there.

As to being guilty of I feel perfectly innocent of any act unbecoming an officer or gentleman since I reached this place or from my friend Haddock, if charges have been prepared against me I ask the privilege of meeting you in person to see if I can be allowed an opportunity of seeing you at your office & feel satisfied that I can satisfy you that I have been guilty of nothing improper.

My reason for seeking to see you at this place was to present to you a list which I was desirous that I should succeed in getting some which I was allowed to bring with me here, would like to have the privilege of having my list at the Planter's house.

William McKendree Perry after being duly sworn upon oath says. I was arrested about six weeks since by as I was informed Capt David's company in Carroll County, sugar tree bottom, or as it is sometimes called Wakudah prairie. The defendants John H. Mossee, George F. Fields, William H. Snowden, A. J. Creasey and Albert M. Clark, ~~were~~ and were captured with me. The three others not named run off on their way up to Richmond. The circumstances attending my arrest are as follows. When the order for enrolling the militia first came out, we thought that every body liable to military duty had to take up arms either upon one side or the other. My sympathies were southern, and I felt that I could not take arms against

my principles. I would have three or four days  
after the order came out for enrolling the  
militia I found a company commanded  
by Capt Austin, with the understanding that  
all would be sworn in to the ~~the~~ Regular  
Confederate army. I told them at the time  
I would join no company for Bushwhack  
in purpose. I was opposed to a guerrilla  
war. I was then assured that the company  
would try to make its way to Price's  
army and that no fighting would  
be done unless we were attacked on  
our way to said army. As I was going  
from the camp after I had joined I met  
John Merriek, (who I was told had before  
practised law in Carroll County) and he  
was pointed out to me as the regular re-  
cruiting officer for Price's army. I was  
informed before that he was the regular  
recruiting officer, by men that had  
seen as they said his commission. Our  
company was to be sworn in under him.  
The next day after I joined the company  
the first Lieut by the name of John Mc  
Guire, detailed me, and put under my  
charge fourteen men, for the purpose of  
going on a scout to prep guns. I was in-  
structed by the first Lieutenant to take guns  
from Union men, and from all secessionists  
that were not going along with us.



with the others that run into the brush  
as we came to Richmond. I suppose we  
might nearly all <sup>have</sup> got away but as we were  
captured I thought it wrong to make  
the effort. I gave the first information  
that the others had ~~we~~ escaped. The cir-  
cumstances of our capture are these. I saw  
a federal hat <sup>we were</sup> as ~~we were~~ riding along.  
The man raised up and cried halt.  
Then I think about seventy men raised  
up and pointed their guns. We imme-  
diately halted and stood still until  
the word was given us to advance.  
We then advanced and were dis-  
armed of our guns taken pris-  
oners and brought to Richmond  
where we remained four or five  
days. We were then brought to  
St Joseph where we have been ever  
since. If our party were not cap-  
tured for the reason that they were  
not with <sup>us</sup>. Three of the men that  
was not captured I had sent to a  
house to get two guns, which I  
had understood to be in the house.  
The other three had had struck off  
from the party to go part their homes.  
In our capture no guns were fired and  
no one injured. This boy Chuck says he  
is sixteen years old the 15<sup>th</sup> of Dec. next.  
I would not think he was old. He did  
not belong to the company. He said  
I went into camp on an errand from






I have to report that sometime during last night three men employed as nurses in that part of the Hospital on the east side of the street, escaped. Their names are Henry Bell, William Bell, and Samuel McLaughlin. Henry Bell is about 6 ft in high. Blue eyes, Brown hair and wore a new blue-ribbed jeans coat. Wm Bell is about 6 ft in high - blue eyes, brown hair and wore a new blue-ribbed jeans coat. McLaughlin is about 5 ft 7 or 8 in high, dark hair, grey eyes and wore blue pants.

After a careful examination of the premises I am convinced that they escaped by passing and eluding the vigilance of the guards. My opinion from certain circumstances narrated to me by other inmates of the Hosp. is that they escaped early in the evening.







I have to report you the escape from this prison of Saml. Clifford and Tom. M. White, which occurred between three and six o'clock this P. M.

The last account I have of them they were seen in the yard and hall of the prison at about three o'clock today and at six o'clock when Mr. Nye, my asst went to look up the "dangerous prisoners" they were missing. A strict search in all parts of the prison was immediately instituted but the missing birds were not found.

Clifford is a horse thief and spy, 21 yrs of age 5ft 10" tall, blue eyes, chestnut hair, very pleasant expression when he smiles with a sort of rollicking reckless look however will probably weigh 145 to 155 lbs. freckled slightly in the face.

Tom. M. White is Cit. of Lewis Co Mo Captured in Adams Co Mo, Feb 9, 1863, is 5ft 10 1/2 in high 32 yrs of age, dk hair & dk eyes.

In conclusion I have to say that with the guard at present on duty at this post, I cannot insure the

safety of a single prisoner in the house.

I am well satisfied from all I can find out that the prisoners passed the guard at the lower entrance to the prison (the gate ordered for that place not being put up yet)

Will you please call and examine the prison and prison arrangements either in person or by deputy. If convenient I should prefer a personal examination.







where a portion of one Company of this Battalion  
were bushwhacked some three or four weeks since.

These men are from another portion of  
Clark County - They are notoriously dis-  
loyal men and have been the main  
instruments in keeping up rebel sympa-  
-thies and avowed opposition to the Govern-  
-ment. <sup>in their neighborhood</sup> The evidence in their cases is con-  
-sidered very reliable, a portion of it is from  
their own friends who are Southern sympa-  
-thizers - Much more <sup>of</sup> like character can be

obtained but I deemed it unnecessary - The loyal portion of their neighborhood are unanimous in requesting that these men may be sent out of the country - in order that they may have peace in future - I wish to suggest ~~that~~ in the case of A. F. Helm, that when a prisoner in St Louis before I am informed that a Union man of considerable prominence by the name of Jones (a friend of Helms) went his security on his Bond and that the family and friends of Helm are making an effort to get him to influence if possible his release + return home. This would greatly lessen the apparent good which is resulting from a few examples being made of the worst men in different neighborhoods -

~~5<sup>th</sup> John Leeper of Schuyler County, a notorious rebel who has some two or three sons in Burns bushwhacking and horse stealing company - he has been feeding and harboring bushwhackers ever since the trouble was commenced~~  
It is very necessary in my judgment that these men should all be sent South of the river - pm

I have ordered that in each case with the exception of Sleepers they be allowed to take to the amount of One Hundred and Fifty dollars in money with them for their individual use, and that their other property remain subject to such disposition as the Department may see proper to order -

We have also a case I suppose of Confirmed insanity in this prison in the person of Andrew M Creary. I learn from another prisoner who knew him some Twelve to Sixteen years ago, in Franklin County Ill. Mr Miller says he was a Lawyer of some prominence

then, that during this time his wife died and  
about a year afterwards he became insane and  
was so regarded by the Community generally. Had  
not seen him for some twelve years, until they  
met here in prison. I called Col. Dick's atten-  
tion to this case some three months ago, and I  
pointed him out to Capt Dwight during his

I hope that you will not finally dispose of him till his Father comes down. — See his Statement, which I have no doubt is strictly true, excepting what he says about Gen. Merrill.

11. G. B. Miller, captured with a revolver on his person in a bad locality. I suppose that he is a Bushwhacker but has no evidence. I hope that he will be kept out of North Missouri.
